2. WRC Community Transport update

Community Transport Fund Accountability Interim Report

The round of accountability interim report closed on 15th September for funding distributed last March. This will be reviewed in the next couple of weeks. The primary aim for the interim report is to gain clarity on what is being captured and feedback on what is valuable, noting that the final report will be due after March to capture the year's transport provision data.

Next funding applications

At this stage, next funding applications will open in November until December, decisions will be made by February and funds will be distributed by March. The funding has increased from \$200K to \$300K.

NTA survey by Let's Drive Change group

4. Anything else

Sarah pointed out that Community Transport providers are entirely operated by grants, donations and koha.

She encourages providers to be mindful not to "charge" passengers; we must not specify an amount and need to allow for reduced or no koha without denial of travel, per the law.

She added comments in recognition of how far everyone in the forum has come over the last 8 years, noting that many receive funding support from WRC, Te Whatu Ora, etc, but many still do not.
